CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

Hard work beats talent when talent doesn't work hard.

PROFESSIONALISM POINTS

Each student is awarded a professionalism grade each day for work in class. Students can receive a maximum of 5 points per day. The factors considered in the awarding of professionalism points are:

- **WORK ETHIC**

- Students arrive on time and prepared for class.
 - Students will have their pencil and choir folder with our assigned music only. Students will be given a choir folder. These folders will be used to keep class notes, assignments, listening assignments, and quiz papers from class. This is especially important since there's no textbook for choir.
 - Students with electronic devices will place devices in the appropriate pouch for class. The device remains there for the duration of the class.
 - Students are allowed and encouraged to have a personal water bottle, filled with only water.
- Students follow direction of staff the first time staff offers directions.
- Students will submit assignments, forms, permission slips, etc, on time.
- Students will accept the consequences of the actions (including consequences of inactions).
- Students are responsible for their own attitude and effort. We expect students to be able to manage their own emotions and to ask for help from a staff member when needed. This includes energy and enthusiasm. You will probably not love every minute of every song, but your attitude will not take that joy away from someone else.

- **DEVELOPING MUSICIANSHIP**

- Students are able to perform a passage with accurate musical qualities, including pitch, rhythm, dynamics.
- Students demonstrate appropriate physical technique, including posture and diction.
- Students will complete classwork assignments both digitally and on paper.
- Students will maintain their choir folder, keeping only the materials necessary for class in the folder. These folders may be collected without warning and be assessed as part of the daily grade.

- **MEMBERSHIP**

- Students are not eating or chewing gum during class (1. Gross, especially while singing; 2. This is highly distracting behavior).
- Students are on task during rehearsal and remain in their assigned spot during rehearsal (ie-side conversations are for outside class; students are not to work on other classwork during this time)
- Students will collaborate and cooperate with staff and peers in a variety of tasks, both musical and non-musical in nature.
- Students will be quiet and attentive when staff are giving directions. This is not just for our musical growth, but also the safety of our students.
- Students will support their fellow choir members in words and actions. We are developing a musical family during our time together and appropriate audience and performance etiquette is expected.

ILLNESS

- If you are unable to participate due to illness or injury, notify the director on the way into the room by signing the logbook on the piano.
- If you become ill after the class has started and are unable to participate because of illness, you must immediately notify the director.
- An ill student may be allowed to forego classroom singing at the director's discretion for up to a maximum of four days during a school year. After that, a parental note will be required. However, you are still expected to follow along with the work done in class and to complete the designated written and listening assignments. This is not to be used as an opportunity to do work from another class.
- In cases of extended illness or habitual non-participation, a doctor's note may be required.
- If you have any other needs of a non-emergency nature, notify the instructor without disrupting class by signing the logbook near the door on the way into the classroom.

CLASSROOM CONSEQUENCES.....

Behavior is always a matter of choice. Often problems can be avoided by thoughtful reflection before acting. Discipline matters which are violations of the school discipline code will be handled according to the school discipline code and in cooperation with the appropriate administrator.

CONSEQUENCE LEVELS

Level 1: Verbal Warning

Level 2: Last out (talk to teacher after class)

Level 3: Call or email home

Level 4: Office referral

DRESS REHEARSALS & CONCERTS

DRESS REHEARSALS

- In order to sing in the concert, you must have attended the dress rehearsal.
- Dress rehearsals will usually be held after school on the day of the concert, or as announced ahead of time.
- Medical or dental appointments of an emergent nature or unavoidable college visitations are considered an excused absence from a dress rehearsal; although, it is recommended to avoid these if at all possible. If this is the case, please have a parents or guardian send us a parents square or email to the directors.
- Other exceptions will be granted only when a parent has made arrangements one week in advance; when the director, after consulting with the administration, deems that extenuating circumstances were of an unavoidable nature; or in cases of severe illness. The director reserves the right to require medical documentation to confirm the severity of the illness.

EXTRA REHEARSALS

- Every attempt will be made to keep additional out-of-school rehearsals to a minimum. They are sometimes necessary, however, to help the students achieve their best performance.
- Notice of mandatory rehearsal will be given at least one week in advance.
- Failure to attend a mandatory rehearsal will cause a loss of points, a decrease in the student's concert grade average, and may prevent the student from participating in the upcoming concert, subject to the director's discretion.
- The director reserves the right to lower a student's grade when a rehearsal is missed with insufficient documentation.

CONCERT EXPECTATIONS

Concerts are the most critical activity of the choir class. They are a demonstration of the learning that is taking place in the classroom on a daily basis. Your attendance, behavior, performance, and promptness at concerts and dress rehearsals are all considered in the assignment of final grades. Plenty of advanced notice is given so you can make arrangements to attend.

Since the learning that occurs at a concert is a result of observing other performers in action as well as performing, students are required to remain for the entire length of the concert in order to receive full credit for the concert.

PERFORMANCE AT ALL CONCERTS IS A REQUIRED PART OF THE CLASS

- A numerical grade is based upon work ethic (punctuality, attentiveness to direction, etc), musicianship (performance represents the work we've done in class), and ensemble efforts (punctuality, correct dress, on-stage and off-stage behavior, and musical contribution).
- If you miss a concert due to an excused absence, a make-up assignment must be completed.
- No make-up credit will be given for concerts missed due to work, lack of transportation, or other unapproved excuses.
- The only exceptions that will be made are in cases of severe illness or when your parent/guardian has made arrangements, **IN WRITING**, at least one week before the concert date. The director reserves the right to require medical documentation when appropriate or to deny the absence following consultation with the CHS Principal for absences other than illness, funerals, or religious holidays.
- All excused concert absences must be made up to receive proper concert credit.
- Unexcused absences won't be made up & will be entered as a zero in the grade book, & could result in dismissal from group.

CONCERT ATTIRE

- Choral Uniforms for Symphonic Choir and Concert Choir (Treble/Bass Choir) are provided and required to wear at our concerts. Every student will be fitted at the beginning of year for their uniform. Cost and the pieces provided vary for each group. Symphonic Choir must purchase the required jewelry.
- Please note: Points will be deducted from your concert grade for failure to wear the required concert attire. The teacher should be notified in advance of any extenuating circumstances.
- Uniform pieces **MUST** be returned after the May concert. Students will be responsible for the cost of any items not returned.
- We will have 2 concerts with more casual concert attire (typically a speciality t-shirt for that concert and jeans). Additional details about this will be released closer to concert time.

CHORAL UNIFORMS

- Dresses
 - CHS provides: black gown
 - You provide: black flats, you may wear earrings sized like a nickel or smaller; no other jewelry. *Symphonic Choir member will purchase required jewelry
- Tuxes
 - CHS provides: black tuxedo pants, vest, jacket, tie
 - You provide: black shoes, black socks, white dress shirt

GRADES

GRADING SCALE

Grades are determined as follows:

Quarterly Grades

33% - Daily Work

34% - Concert Grades

33% - Quiz Grades (both written & singing)

INDIVIDUAL QUIZ GRADES

- Quiz grades will constitute $\frac{1}{3}$ of the quarterly grade average.
- Areas to be evaluated include: musical notation and terminology, physiological terminology, singing checks over concert music, listening and musical dictation, historical information, and musical literature covered in class.
- Students will also have a semester final. The semester final exam is in accordance with guidelines from CHS administration and will be part of the final grade. The semester final will incorporate a variety of material students learned throughout the semester.

MAKE-UP WORK AND ASSIGNMENTS

- Daily Absence / Attendance in class is necessary to make a significant contribution to the choir. It is important that students communicate with the teacher to see if there is make-up work that needs to be done.
- Concert Absence / Since the concerts for choir are essentially the test for the material learned in class, it is necessary that these “tests” be made up if an absence should occur. Work should be made up within a week of the student’s return to class, unless the student has made special arrangements with the teacher. It is your responsibility to see the teacher for a make-up assignment for an excused concert absence.

SYMPHONIC & FORTE HONORS

- Any Symphonic and Forte student can register with their counselor to take the class for honors credit. These students will be responsible for extra requirements.
 - Voice lessons / each honors student must take voice lessons from an approved teacher for the entire school year and must log at least six 30-minute lessons for each quarter (talk to your teacher if you can't make this work)
 - Perform a solo at OMEA Solo & Ensemble Contest on January 24, 2026.

NOVAE A CAPPELLA

Novae is our extracurricular a cappella group that is auditioned and practices outside the school day. Novae rehearses on Mondays and Wednesdays from 6-8 pm at CHS. Auditions will be on Tues. Aug. 19 & Wed. Aug. 20. Students can learn more and sign up for an audition time with the QR code on the bulletin board outside the choir room.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

- When a bus is provided by the school system for a school-related event, ALL STUDENTS MUST RIDE THE BUS unless prior arrangements have been made in writing and approved by the director.
- In addition, students are expected to ride only the bus to which they have been assigned. Any exceptions to this rule are to be made at the director's discretion only.
- Due to the liability factors involved, students who disregard these rules will be disciplined accordingly.

CHORAL SERVICE AWARDS

Service awards are presented each year at the choir banquet. These awards are gained through earning service points beyond the scope of the daily classroom. The total points for each award is as follows:

First Level Award - 400 points (Choir Letter)

Second Level Award - 700 points (Pin)

Third Level Award - 1100 points (Plaque)

Fourth Level Award - 1500 points (Baton)

Fifth Level Award - 2000 points (Special Plaque)*

* only if fourth level was received the prior year
